Background of the	There is no institute of individual assistants in the
legislation for PA services	Republic of Belarus. Social services existing in the
	country are overwhelmingly state-owned. And at the
	same time there are a lot of restrictions in rendering free
	services to needy persons with disabilities, depending
	from their financial status (poverty), presence of close
	relatives (the fact of having working relatives restricts a
	disabled from getting free services, and sometimes
	relatives, also on financial grounds, are not capable of
	providing for proper care of the disabled).
	According to the law there can be "a person taking care
	of a disabled". This system creates a discriminatory
	situation for these persons in comparison with the other
	categories of workers, because the money he/she gets is
	"benefit" and their salary and social protection are very problematic in the general norms of legislation. The list
	of services rendered is not exhaustive for the provision
	of unassisted living for some categories of persons with
	disabilities. It should be mentioned that at present the
	legislative bodies of our country are preparing to make
	some changes to the existing legislation, including the
	changes to the list of free services to needy persons with
	disabilities. At present, the provision of services to
	persons with disabilities living in rural areas is especially
	insufficient.
